ECT Midpoint survey

Thank you to the ECTs who completed the Teach First Survey in January. Teach First have now shared the responses with us. We were delighted with the results, which were overwhelmingly positive, including an 86% overall satisfaction rate. Other positives included the fantastic support ECTs are receiving from mentors, and the job satisfaction reported by ECTs themselves.

Of course there are still areas for us to work on and we are already working with Teach First on streamlining the amount of course content, and some of the current repetition involved which Teach First are keen to address. Online seminars will aim to quickly identify the key takeaways and give more time for discussion and networking – something ECTs identified as having missed because of the online delivery this year. You will be pleased to hear that Year 2 seminars will be delivered in person – details are currently being worked out and we'll let you know our plans as soon as we can.

We will work with Teach First to ensure that the ECF does not add to teachers' workloads, but supports with classroom practice, as is intended.
